On June 10, 2014, the Islamic State of Iraq and al-Sham (ISIS) laid claim to Mosul, Iraq's second city.<sup>2</sup> In ensuing days, ISIS would take over government buildings, seize control of major oil fields, and begin an advance toward the capital city, Baghdad. On June 29, just 19 days after the fall of Mosul, the group would formally declare the birth of a new Islamic State, or *al-Dawla al-Islāmiyya*. The fall of Mosul to ISIS represents one of the most dramatic events in the modern history of Iraq. It also had transformative consequences. At the time of the assault, Iraq was deeply
